Update about April 15th workshop:

Based on the responses to the survey, and comments of the owners present at the meeting, the River Vista HOA BOD did not see the need to change our current rules. Owners of River Vista HOA will continue to have the rights and privilege to rent their homes under the current conditions:

- -Rentals should be for a minimum duration of 7 days.
- -Occupancy should be limited to 2 persons per legal bedroom, consistent with River Vista Covenants and Restrictions. Legal bedroom are listed in the St. Lucie County property appraiser website www.pasic.org.

A rental guideline has been created to give to property managers and owners. It is recommended to include this form in your rental contract. The form is attached via email.

WASTE PRO


Waste Pro will not

Checklist:

- -Batteries
- -Battery-operated radio with weather band
- -Flashlight
- -Candles and matches
- -Fire extinguisher
- -Bottled water (1 gallon per person a day)
- -External battery for your cellular phone
- -Fully charged laptop, iPad and other device
- -Full tank of gas for your vehicle
- -Test your generator if you have one and gas supply
- -Propane tank for barbecue. it may be your only way to cook food if power is lost.
- -Important documents (insurance policy, ID 's etc..)
- -Cash
- -Non-perishable food item.
- -Manual can opener
- -Pet food if needed
- -Prescription medicine (3 day supplies)
- -First-aid kit
- -Hygiene and personal care items
- -Mosquito repellent
- -Duct tape

if you decide to stay:

- -Fill bathtub with water
- -Get food supplies early and stock on fresh fruits and veggies that do not require cooking
- -Cook pasta or grain that can be used in salad.
- -Let your neighbor or friends know that you plan on staying.

Vero Beach Train Station Museum

The last train pulled out of the Vero Beach train station in 1968. Once, this little wooden building was the lifeblood of this town.

These tracks were built in the late 1800's. But there was no station here — you had to "whistle stop" the train so it would stop to pick you up — until Florida pioneer Henry Flagler built a stopping place in 1903. For the next 65 years, this was a terminal not only for passengers, but also for the abundant citrus crops produced nearby.

By 1968, travelers were coming to Florida by automobile and by plane. So the Vero Beach train station, once brimming with life, stood empty until 1983. That's when a Florida historian named Dr. Eugene Lyons bought the station from the Florida East Coast Railroad – for \$1.
